



The Danube Summer Institute offers a rich cross-cultural academic experience for students, anchored by the collaboration of Prof. Dr. Winand Gellner of the Department of Political Science at The University of Passau and his Lehrstuhl, and Prof. John Robertson of the Department of Political Science at Texas A&M University. A native of the Rhineland Palatinate state of Germany, Professor Gellner earned his Ph. D. in Political Science from the University of Trier in 1987 and completed his habilitation in 1994 on the basis of his pioneering research on think tanks and political networks within Europe, Germany and the United States.

He was a Fulbright Fellow in the American Studies Program at New York University in 1989 and a Fellow of the American Council of Learned Societies (ACLS) at the University of California, Berkeley, in 1990. He held the position of Guest Professor at John E. Dolibois European Center of the University of Miami, Ohio in Luxembourg during 1995 – 1999, and Visiting Scholar at the Institute for European Studies at Cornell University in 2000. He is the Editor of the Politik.IM.Netz on-line political science journal, and has published widely on think tanks, political networks, political parties in European, the European Union and German politics. He has been a Professor at the University of Passau in Political Science since 1997. Professor Gellner has visited Texas many times, having offered several guest lectures to students and faculty. His energy and ceaseless dedication to international studies, German and European politics and cross-cultural extensions of studying political science make Professor Gellner an invaluable and uniquely gifted partner to Texas A&M University and a rich and compelling resource for the participants of the Danube Summer Institute.
